Dr. King's powerful message of freedom and equality for all people will be explored further with a virtual tour of the Johnson House, presented in partnership with History Hunters. We'll learn all about the people who fought for racial justice in Philadelphia in this Underground Railroad Station and House Museum. We'll also present opportunities for service-learning during the MLK Day of Service and provide additional teaching resources and ideas for exploring the episode's themes.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s inspiring "I Have a Dream" speech is brought to life through the beautiful and vibrant illustrations of Caldecott Honor winning artist Kadir Nelson. Dr. King delivered this speech in 1963 in front of the Lincoln Memorial during the March on Washington.
