

"Color Your City with Caleb and Olivia" Suggestions for Viewing Episode



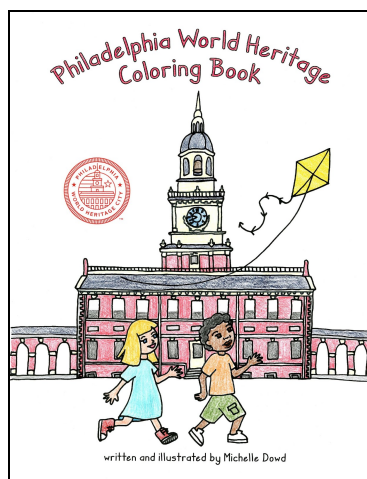
What is Heritage Storytime?

Heritage Storytime (HS) is a series of monthly storytime episodes presented virtually for children. Each HS episode will focus on a heritage-related theme and will feature a children's book read-along as well as complementary learning materials and activities. HS nurtures our desire to tell stories about our lives and heritages, past and present, and to learn through these stories. HS is especially important now due to the constraints that COVID-19 has imposed on teachers and families.

Marilyn Russell of WOGL FM will be reading the Philadelphia World Heritage Coloring Book, which features Caleb and Olivia visiting important cultural and historic sites all over Philadelphia. Then we'll do a fun coloring activity from the book before getting up and showing off our Keith Haring mural inspired dance moves! We'll also learn how local students have used the Coloring Book to create their own heritage projects, many of which you can do yourself. Additional teaching resources and ideas for exploring the episode's themes will be included, too.

Here are some questions that teachers, students, and families can explore when they view this episode of HS:

1. How does Melissa help you think about heritage? About diversity?
2. What can we learn from stories about Philadelphia? Philadelphia's historical places? How do Melissa and Sarah help you to think about your own heritage?
3. What should Caleb and Olivia take on their adventure around the city? Snacks? Drinks?
4. Have you ever flown a kite? Did it get away? What happened? Did you get it back? How?
5. Do you know about any of the sites that Caleb and Olivia visited? Which ones?
6. Do you have any books about these sites?
7. Have you ever been to another neighborhood in Philadelphia or another city? Or even another country?
8. Have you noticed that other neighborhoods, cities, countries, and people may look different than what you are used to seeing? What was different? What was the same?
9. Philadelphia has a very special combination of unique people, places, and cultures that help us be a World Heritage City! Did you know that?
10. Are there sites that are special in your own heritage? What are they? Where? What would you like your friends to know about these sites?
11. What places are special to you in your neighborhood? What would you tell Caleb and Olivia about them?
